Center Church Parsonage/Rental Update

Thank you to the Center Church members' patience as we work through the process of decisions on what to do with the church "parsonage/rental."

A little background

- Built in 1951.
- Housed 9 different pastoral families.
- Fire occurred in 2005.
- Started Renting in 2007.
- Congregation vote at October 2022 meeting to sell building.
- Waiting Northern Ohio District Board Approval for Sale.

Recent Update: In preparing for that sale to make sure the property is in good condition, it was determined that the church septic tank is located on the house parcel and that the system for the house has been connected to the discharge line for church septic, probably due to failure of house leach field. The current setup was done without a permit and there is no record of either system on file at the Health Department (not uncommon for older systems). Systems do not meet current requirements. Based on these findings it has been determined that it is necessary to install a new system for both properties prior to listing the house for sale. As the cost of this project is very high priced (could be between \$35,000 and \$50,000), on Sunday, August 13, the Congregation had a mini-meeting to discuss this capital improvement. We voted to "give the

housing committee approval to paid what expenditures needed to get the correct permits, testing etc." They have moved forward with getting quotes and looking into fi-



nancing options and bring updates to the next Congregational Meeting.
